Shalom from Shelby

The introduction to the Feasting on the Word Lenten Companion (ed. Bartlett, Brown Taylor, and Bracken Long) begins with the following claim:

"Easter is the highest holy day of the Christian faith, but to celebrate it in a vacuum, without immersion in all that comes before the resurrection—both chronologically and theologically—robs the day of its true significance. Lent can be a hard sell for many worshipers, with its intentional solemnity and encouragement toward self-denial. Others find it to be the most meaningful time of year—the most honest time of year, when we wrestle with the hard things of life and walk with Jesus through the darkest days of his life as well." (vii.)

In the past, I have found myself among those who dreaded the season of Lent. Though I appreciated the trials and tribulations that Jesus endured, to focus on them for six whole weeks felt pretty gloomy. I'd rather skip to the beauty and power of the resurrection. However, I have struggled with clinical depression since I was in middle school - a difficult mental illness that can be all-consuming. This past year and a half was very difficult for me as I battled a deep depression that seemed to suck the life right out of me. I didn't feel like myself and struggled to connect with others and with God. Though I am a mental health advocate (for others), it can be challenging to share one's own struggles. I know I am not alone - everyone faces seasons of difficulty and pain. And this year, as we have begun our preparations for the upcoming Lenten season, I've noticed a shift in my perspective. I am grateful to say that the combination of a medication change and the birth of my son brought me out of my depression and into a season of great joy. But I have recently felt the deep despair and loneliness that allows me to re-identify more personally with the journey of Jesus... that which comes before the joy of the resurrection.

What a comfort it is to know that my God experienced the complicated mix of suffering and delight that is being human. What a consolation that God chose solidarity with humankind and understands our pain, our fears, our hopes, and our heartbreak. So if we open ourselves up to the discomfort, we may just find solace in a season that takes an honest look at the hardships of life and faith. There might be relief in letting go of the illusion that we have it all together. If we allow ourselves to explore what it means that Christ suffered and died on the cross, we could discover new depths of our faith and learn something about ourselves in the process. This year, let us see the season of Lent as an opportunity to bring fresh meaning to familiar texts.

As the introduction in the Feasting on the Word Lenten Companion later says, "It is dangerous to meet Jesus in the dark places, to ask the same questions of ourselves that Jesus asks of his disciples, to accept Jesus' radical <u>touch</u>. In these moments of utter truth and honesty, we find ourselves vulnerable enough to connect with the risen Christ as never before." (vii.)

May it be so.


